



	<p>Title IX Statement</p> <p>Arcadia University is committed to assuring a safe and productive educational environment for all students. In order to meet this commitment and to comply with Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 and guidance from the Office for Civil Rights, the University requires faculty members to report incidents of sexual violence shared by students to the University's Title IX Coordinator. <p>City Connection:</p>	<p>Philadelphia's central place in American history is deeply connected to the local architecture and to the collections of art that are found in the city.
