



	<p>Rights, the University requires faculty members to report incidents of sexual violence shared by students to the University's Title IX Coordinator. The only exceptions a faculty member's reporting obligation are when incidents of sexual violence are communicated by a student during a classroom discussion, in a writing assignment for a class, or as part of a University-approved research project.</p> <p>Information regarding the reporting of sexual violence and the resources that are available to victims of sexual violence is set forth at https://www.arcadia.edu/university/policies-guidelines/title-ix.</p>
